Digital Streetwork & Online-Support – Reaching and Engaging Target Groups

The model project "Social Media Streetwork" develops and offers multilingual, outreach-based initial information and referral advice via social media. This initiative is specifically aimed at marginalized EU migrants, minority communities, and individuals experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

The main intention of the Digital Streetwork workshop is to provide professionals and interested individuals with essential knowledge and skills to effectively utilize digital platforms for outreach work. Participants will gain:

- a detailed understanding of outreach strategies on digital social networks.
- insights into the strategic development of digital presences on established platforms.
- practical approaches to engaging and communicating with social media users.
- knowledge on referral counselling and how digital tools can connect users to free counselling services and social institutions.

The workshop aims to promote a broader understanding of digital streetwork methodologies and how they can be adapted in transnational contexts.

The workshop will take place **online** and will be held in **English**. To ensure accessibility and participation, breakout sessions can be organized in multiple languages. We also offer options in German, Bulgarian, Croatian, Italian, Polish, and Romanian. These correspond to the 7 working languages of the project.
